


If-clauses type II

Diesen Typ des Bedingungssatzes wendest du bei unerfüllbaren Bedingungen an.

If-Satz → Bedingung	Hauptsatz → Folge
PAST TENSE	would, could, might + infinitive
If she went to New York,	she could go to a drama school.
Wenn sie nach N Y ginge (gehen würde),	könnte sie auf eine Schauspielschule gehen .
If she had her own apartment,	she would invite famous movie stars.
Wenn sie eine eigene Wohnung hätte ,	würde sie ... einladen .
If New York wasn't so far away,	she might go there on her next vacation.
Wenn N Y nicht so weit weg wäre ,	würde sie vielleicht ...dorthin fahren .

☞ **Kein would im if-Satz!**



Wie im Deutschen kann der Hauptsatz auch vor dem If-Satz stehen, z.B.:
 Marcia **would help** poor and disabled people if she **was** a famous star.
